

A huge transformation has taken place at the FitzRoy Day Service in Trafford, Manchester. Using money raised by fundraising events and grants, the whole building has been revamped and the members are loving it.



With a brand new kitchen, bigger art room, computer suite, and a relaxed and spacious communal area, the members are enjoying new activities, socialising and eating together. They're cooking up a storm in the newly kitted out training kitchen which has a rise and fall hob, side opening low level ovens, height adjustable work spaces, and accessible equipment such as talking scales, jugs and timers, allowing more people to get involved in sessions.

Now set over two floors, they've managed to incorporate a multisensory room, break out room for peace and quiet, a lift, and an extra changing room with a bed and ceiling track hoist.

FitzRoy provide exceptional end of life care

End of life care is a particularly difficult time for carers and families. This inspiring case study from our award-winning FitzRoy **Supported Living team in London** shows how to get it right.

One of the people they supported was diagnosed with terminal cancer and his life changed immeasurably. He suffered from anxiety, and his family were not able to be involved as much as they'd like, so the FitzRoy team went out of their way to help him talk about his illness, and cope with his emotions. In true personcentred style they listened to his wishes and made them come true.

He wanted to marry his partner, stay at home for as long as possible, and move only once.

They supported him to stay in his home, and they made sure he was only moved once, to a hospice. They arranged a wedding and the couple were married in the hospice surrounded by friends and family. They extended this care to his circle of support, in particular his girlfriend, and the other residents close to him, and worked hard to make the most of his 'good days' including trips out, and a meal with friends.

The FitzRoy team worked hard communicating with a number of agencies and health professionals involved in his treatment. They ensured there weren't too many people visiting on the same day, his appointments were kept, and his views and feelings were taken into account at every meeting.

This shows why person-centred care is at the heart of FitzRoy; it ensures individuals are listened to, and their needs and desires are prioritised at every stage of life.

At first he was unsure, lacked confidence, and had never learnt how to manage his own home. Through patience and commitment he worked hard with staff to learn these new skills, and eventually became more confident.

He was supported to set up a bank account to manage his money, look after his belongings and clothes, wash, cook, and make friends. With his new found control over his finances he was able to buy things for his room and himself, and generally take control of his life.

This hard work led to his big dream coming true; he made the move to his very own flat and with support from FitzRoy he has continued to develop his independence.

Mitchell has minimal support now, and is still learning new skills. He's using local transport so he can widen his horizons, and after buying a new computer, he's signed up to a computer course. The team at Clarence road are so happy he is enjoying his independence in his new home and we wish him every success for his new life.
